Born on July 22, 1954, Tony lost his battle on Thursday 12/13/2018. He was educated through his coursework at Boston’s Bunker Hill Community College and Polytechnic Institute in Boston. An avid learner, Tony gave back to the community through volunteer programs at schools and teaching youth. He was a voracious reader who read several books a week for years and local libraries knew Tony well. He could truly speak on any topic but the world economy was his current favorite topic of discussion. In addition to reading, Tony loved to travel, play chess, poems of Robert Service, building furniture and was never without a good joke to share. Everybody enjoyed Tony and he made others feel better in his presence. Pre-deceased parents were Antonio Alfred Aubertin and Margaret Mary (Alger) Aubertin, both of NH. He will be greatly missed by his 7 siblings and numerous nieces and nephews.
