“ I met Chris when he was almost finished high school, in 1985. After school he use to hang out at the electronic shop in the plaza where the office I worked in was located. Along with Greg, the shop manager, we started a DJ group called the Rhythmic Rock Masters.

We were pretty busy and had loads of fun. Chris was "The Captain", I was "2, 2 Good", Greg was "Super-G". Also joining us were "1-Alf", "Automix", "Joey Jam" and "DJ Pat". We backed many other DJ's at their functions, including "Saint Vic" and Anthony Delaney along with a few of his ZNS Radio colleagues. In this way we formed a wide, extended family. We originated a lot of the DJ styles you would hear today in Nassau, Bahamas, live and on the spot at functions, out of necessity at that moment. I "retired" after 10 fun-filled years but all the others are still in the game today.

A few years later video cameras came out and I would take my camera to functions. Chris later told me that this is what inspired him to get into videography. It was at a movie project we ventured into that Chris met April and the rest we all know. When Chris and his family moved to the US I didn't see him as much but would always get to see him videotaping the Junkanoo parades during the Christmas season, assisted by Super-G.

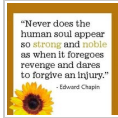
