I remember when Hurricane Irma hit Orlando in 2017. My daughter was an infant, and the Kamalii's had recently moved in above us. This hurricane had caused us both to be without power for 2.5 days. We shared what we had, and went into survival mode.

During this time I learned Darin was WAY better at starting (and managing) a fire than I. Looking back at it, he knew his fire building skills were superior, but he went about showing it in such a humble and gentle way. So I decided to just find wood and fodder for the fire, and brought my pot of soup to cook for everyone.

This day became my introduction to Hawaiian sea salt on ribeye steak. When I tell you that was THE best ribeye I have ever tasted....everything was PERFECT. This changed my life forever also (Lol). I now only buy ribeye's, season with only sea salt, and grill them. I have never been able to recreate Darin's perfection that day, but I have worked hard to come close.

In my mind, I had played the scenario of picking only one person/family to be stuck with during an apocalypse, and my decision was always (and quickly) Darin, and the Kamalii family. Between the both of us, we had all the needs covered!

I remember a kid approaching our hurricane bar-b-q, and Darin snapped on him a bit. Leah said, "Dad I've never seen you like that". It was hilarious, because this kid was known for freeloading, and then going home. From flashlights to food, we had each others backs. While the storm was a bit chaotic and took out power, that too was one of my favorite memories. Even though we had no electricity, there was peace.

I will never forget my brother Darin Kamalii, and look forward to seeing him again one day,

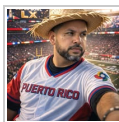
