

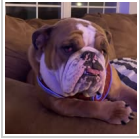


James Theodore Perry

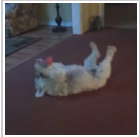

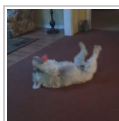

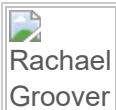
