She worked hard and diligent on all aircraft and engine projects, as though she was planning to build her own airplane one day. Be mindful that Marjie was one of very few People of Color (Female and of African Descent) in the Aviation Maintenance Program.*

*Marjie always seemed super fascinated about flying..., as a pilot. When I told the class that I was also a Certified Flight Instructor, some students took the opportunity to take a flight with me..., and Marjie was one them. She and other students also volunteered to assist with introducing young school-age children to aviation. (A program called “Young Eagles” with the Experimental Aircraft Association 690 Chapter, located northeast of Atlanta)*

*To my surprise, Marjie asked me, “What does it take to be a Pilot?” The next thing I knew, she signed up to be a Student Pilot and I was her 1st Flight Instructor. She took to flying like she really knew that somehow; she was supposed to have wings. She learned to fly that airplane like she was on some sort of mission. Marjie became an FAA Certified Student Pilot on 9/25/2012.*

*As I now reflect on that moment, I am reminded “...what you bind on Earth will be bound in Heaven...”*

*His Eyes are on this Sparrow, named Marjolly Pauyo.... for sure.*

*Marjie believed in goodness and believed that we are all GOD's children and we all need to treat each other like GOD's children.*
