After COVID almost took my life recently, but I'm making it my next goal to rejoin the Army Guard or Reserves to finish what I started. I love how you used to touch my uniform and look so PROUD of me. I guess this is a way of bringing that back .. those moments..

And the memories to have you there with me when I surprised you and Mom when I'd come home, I wasn't going to tell you, I was just going to do it and surprise you; finish up my military career part time and once I defy the odds again, just let you know to see your next reaction. All I ever wanted to do is keep making you proud. That was my whole life right there...

You were my best friends regardless of when we'd bump heads, I always said there was too much testosterone around when he was between you and me.

I am your son and I had no say who my father was, but after all the memories flowing and thinking of you nonstop; the intense crying when no one is around, I never realized how much I loved you until I had the HONOR, to be the last family member to stand next to your body 2.7 hours after your death. There is one memory that will never fade... COVID stole from us a good man. It's unfair.

If there is one slight happiness, I'd that I got to see you one last time, it is a memory will haunt me for the rest of my life, but it was something I had to do. I hope you heard everything I told you. If there truly is a God I hope that your spirit was there when I told you my inner most thoughts and confessed my devotion and love for you; the love I didn't do a good job showing you always, but it was truly there. I know I have some big shoes to fill.

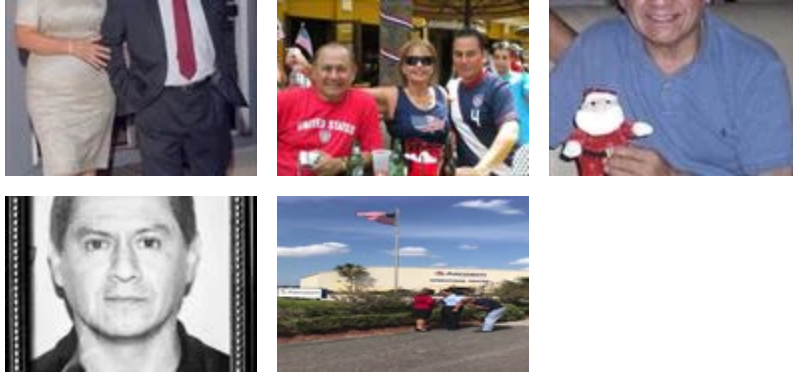
